Every year as school wraps up, SLED chapters around the nation compete for thousands of dollars in cash prizes. To enter, Advisors must submit a video to their Trail Guide that showcases their SLED chapter's accomplishments. The video should be produced by students. Work with your students to collect footage, photos, and tell the story of how SLED has impacted your school!

Our expert judges score each entry based on the submitted video's quality, overall impact, and quality of projects uploaded to the portal by a SLED chapter throughout the school year.



🔆 How to Enter

Get in touch with your Trail Guide and submit a video! Videos should present information clearly in a logical, informative sequence that excites and engages viewers. To score high, include visuals of projects-in-process, project impact, interviews with key stakeholders, and highlight a few key projects! Videos should be no more than 3-8 minutes in length.

The bulk of each Chapter's National Competition score comes from their Chapter's progress throughout the year. Student effort, time spent, and evidence of Design Thinking used for SLED projects throughout the year is a major factor in scoring. Community impact is also taken into account. Reach the highest rank possible in the SLED portal to score big on community impact. Chapters who reach their entire school or spend many hours on projects are the strongest contenders for the prize money.
